To follow this fantastic event closely, there are mobile camps that moved two times in a year in different areas of the **Serengeti National Park** to always be at the center of the action. They are eco-friendly camps that, once disassembled, do not leave permanent marks on the ground.

The Olakira Migration Camp is a family and traditional safari camp that is always in the right place at the right time all year round following the Great Migration through the boundless grasslands of the Serengeti in Tanzania.

From mid-December to March, the camp is located in the **Ndutu area**, adjacent to the Serengeti, where during this time it is possible to observe herds of wildebeest and zebras giving birth.

From June to November the camp is located in what is arguably the most spectacular location in the **north of the Serengeti**, with direct views of the Mara River, making it the ideal camp for experiencing river crossings up close.

This luxurious camp is made up of only nine tents and therefore offers its guests an intimate and personal atmosphere amidst the wilderness. The spacious tents are equipped with large and comfortable double beds or alternatively 2 single beds and a private bathroom with shower.
